HOW TO APPLY FOR THE GRADUATE ACCELERATED TRACK (B.A./M.S.) PROGRAM:

Use this checklist to guide you through the Linguistics Grad Track program. In this program, you are eligible to take up to 12 graduate level courses that will apply to your BA, giving you a jump start on your graduate level degree. All applications must be completely concurrently in **two** parts:

	During the first semester of your senior year in the Grad Track program, you must apply to the Masters' Linguistics Program and the Toulouse Graduate School.
	Pay the \$75 Toulouse Graduate school admission application fee.
	In the custom question portion of the admission application, indicate that you're currently enrolled as a Grad Track Pathway student.
	Courses outside of the listed eligible graduate courses must be prior approved with the Graduate School Council.

ELIGIBLITY FOR ADMISSION

You must be a current UNT Linguistics major in excellent academic standing (GPA 3.5 or higher). At the time of application, you must have completed 75 credit hours (typically by your junior year). You must submit two letters of recommendation from Linguistics faculty members who can attest to your academic ability to graduate work. Materials for the department may be submitted via email ling-admissions@unt.edu.

DEGREE PLAN REOUIREMENT

Admission to the Graduate Accelerated Track Program does not imply admission to a Graduate Academic program. A *maximum of 12 semester hours* earned prior to admission to a degree program may be counted toward degree requirements and may vary by program. Successful completion of graduate courses will count towards the student's cumulative undergraduate GPA. Credits earned in graduate level courses will be posted according to established UNT registrar procedures to the undergraduate transcript upon Bachelor's degree award.
